Dear Jim:

This is the Kindler & Associates, LLC proposal to inspect Franklin Township roads approximately 35 centerline miles.

Scope of Services:

ITEM 1. All inspections will be made following the pavement inspection methodology of ASTM D6433, using the same sample location indicated by house number previously used. By inspecting the same approximate 2,500 square foot sample, direct comparisons can be made, and the pavement condition easily tracked. All work will be performed by a Professional Engineer. The same Professional Engineer who has been involved and worked with PAVER, and the Pavement Inspections on Franklin County roads since 1996.

ITEM 2. The inspection data from each sample location, distresses identified, the severity determined, and the quantity measured will be entered into the PAVER program through the PAVER inspection screen. The Engineer by inputting the data will make an educated general review of the data.

ITEM 3. Producing Reports with the correct charts, graphs and spread sheets from PAVER that are applicable to Franklin Township's needs

Purpose of Form
