I am writing to you regarding the Franklin Township Board of Trustee's request for a Community Funded Project to construct a new public boulevard angling across the southwest quadrant of the W. Broad Street & Georgesville Road intersection.

As State Representative for Ohio House District 6, I see the clear benefits this project would bring to our community. Improving infrastructure at this busy and dangerous intersection would enhance safety and mobility for residents, addressing critical transportation challenges in the area.
