

Resolution 2026-145
**A Resolution Enacting Regulations for the Parking of Vehicles on a
Designated Street and Right-of-Way in Franklin Township, Franklin County,
Ohio (Brookside Boulevard)**

The Board of Trustee of Franklin Township, Franklin County, Ohio met in person in a Regular Meeting at 12:00 p.m. on Thursday, August 20, 2026 . The trustee marked below made a motion for the adoption of the following resolution:

WHEREAS, the Board of Trustees of Franklin Township, Franklin County, Ohio (the “Township”), has determined the public safety and welfare would be served by the following parking regulations; and,

WHEREAS, the State of Ohio has granted townships the authority to adopt resolutions regulating the parking of vehicles on township roads pursuant to the Ohio Revised Code (O.R.C.) Section 505.17.

WHEREAS the regulations adopted herein do not conflict with the Uniform Traffic Act and are applicable only to the unincorporated areas of the Township.

NOW THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED by the Board of Township Trustees of Franklin Township, Franklin County, Ohio that the following resolution be, and it hereby is adopted:

Section 1. No person shall stop, stand, or park any vehicle on both the north and south sides of Brookside Boulevard east of the concrete alley to Plank Place, which is located in the unincorporated area of the Township, including the right-of-way.

Section 2. Owners of vehicles parked in violation of parking regulations enacted by this Resolution will be notified by having a parking ticket handed to the vehicle operator by the Franklin Township Police Department in a manner apparent to the operator of the vehicle, and/or receipt of a summons from the Franklin County Municipal Court Clerk of Court. The ticket to be used pursuant to this Resolution shall be the “Ohio Uniform Traffic Ticket.”

Section 3. Pursuant to O.R.C. Section 505.17(E), parking infractions shall be considered criminal offenses and a person who commits such a violation shall be guilty of a minor misdemeanor.

Section 4. Pursuant to O.R.C. Section 505.17(D), the Board or its designated agent may order into storage any vehicle parked in violation of these regulations. The owner or any lienholder of a vehicle ordered into storage may claim the vehicle upon presentation of proof of ownership, which may be evidenced by a certificate of title to the vehicle, and payment of all expenses, charges, and fines incurred as a result of the parking violation and removal and storage of the vehicle.

Section 5. For violations of Section 1 of these parking regulations, the fine for a first violation shall be \$65.00; the fine for a second violation shall be \$90.00; and the fine for a third or more violations shall be \$100.00. Fines may be paid in person at the Franklin County Municipal Court Clerk of Court during business hours or mailed to the Court at 375 S. High St. 6th Floor, Columbus, Ohio 43215.

Section 6. These regulations are subject to the limitations, restrictions, and exceptions in O.R.C. Chapter 505, Sections 4511.01 through 4511.76, and Sections 4513.02 through 4513.37.

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Section 7. The parking areas regulated as stated above shall be designated by the installation of traffic control devices conforming to O.R.C. Section 4511.09. Vehicles and owners may be exempt from certain restrictions created by this Resolution on the holidays enumerated in O.R.C. Section 511.10 and further specified in O.R.C. Section 1.14.

Section 8. The Township designee is directed to post the regulations in five (5) conspicuous public places in the Township for thirty (30) days and publishing the same for three (3) consecutive weeks using at least one of the following methods:

- (a) In a print or digital newspaper of general circulation in the Township.
- (b) On the official public notice web site established under R.C 125.182
- (c) On the web site and social media account of the Township.

Section 9. It is hereby found and determined that all formal actions of this Board concerning and relating to the passage of this Resolution were taken in an open meeting of this Board, and that all deliberations of this Board and of any of its committees that resulted in such formal action took place in meetings open to the public, in compliance with all legal requirements, including O.R.C. Section 121.22.

Section 10. This resolution shall be in effect immediately upon adoption or as legally permitted by law.

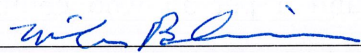

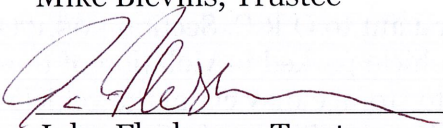

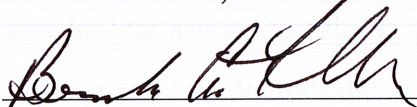

PUBLIC NOTICE

FRANKLIN TOWNSHIP, FRANKLIN COUNTY, OHIO

NOTICE OF ADOPTION OF PARKING REGULATIONS

NOTICE IS HEREBY GIVEN that on **August 20, 2026**, the Board of Township Trustees of Franklin Township, Franklin County, Ohio, adopted a resolution pursuant to **Ohio Revised Code Section 505.17** establishing parking restrictions in the unincorporated area of Franklin Township.

The resolution prohibits that no person shall stop, stand, or park any vehicles on either **north and south sides of Brookside Boulevard, east of the concrete alley to Plank Place**, including the right-of-way, within the unincorporated area of Franklin Township.

Violations shall be enforced by the **Franklin Township Police Department** through the issuance of an **Ohio Uniform Traffic Ticket** and/or by summons issued through the **Franklin County Municipal Court Clerk of Court**. Pursuant to O.R.C. Section 505.17(E), a violation constitutes a criminal offense and is punishable as a **minor misdemeanor**.

Pursuant to O.R.C. Section 505.17(D), the Board of Township Trustees or its designated agent may order into storage any vehicle parked in violation of these regulations. The owner or lienholder may reclaim the vehicle upon providing proof of ownership and paying all applicable expenses, charges, and fines associated with the violation, removal, and storage.

The fines established for violations are as follows:

- **First violation:** \$65.00
- **Second violation:** \$90.00
- **Third or subsequent violation:** \$100.00

Fines may be paid in person at the **Franklin County Municipal Court Clerk of Court** during regular business hours or mailed to:

The parking restrictions shall be designated by appropriate traffic control devices in accordance with O.R.C. Section 4511.09. The resolution is subject to the applicable limitations, restrictions, and exceptions contained in **O.R.C. Chapter 505, Sections 4511.01 through 4511.76, and Sections 4513.02 through 4513.37**, including applicable holiday exceptions.

This notice shall be published for three (3) consecutive weeks in accordance with the resolution.

AVISO DE ADOPCIÓN

FRANKLIN TOWNSHIP, CONDADO DE FRANKLIN, OHIO

POR MEDIO DEL PRESENTE SE HACE SABER que el 20 de agosto de 2026, la Junta de Síndicos de Franklin Township, Condado de Franklin, Ohio, adoptó una resolución de conformidad con la Sección 505.17 del Código Revisado de Ohio, estableciendo restricciones de estacionamiento en el área no incorporada de Franklin Township.

La resolución prohíbe que ninguna persona se detenga, permanezca detenida o estacione ningún vehículo en cualquiera de los lados norte y sur de Brookside Boulevard, al este del callejón de concreto hasta Plank Place, incluyendo el derecho de paso, dentro del área no incorporada de Franklin Township.

Las infracciones serán aplicadas por el Departamento de Policía de Franklin Township mediante la emisión de un Boleto Uniforme de Tránsito de Ohio (Ohio Uniform Traffic Ticket) y/o mediante una citación emitida a través del Secretario del Tribunal Municipal del Condado de Franklin. De conformidad con la Sección 505.17(E) del O.R.C., una infracción constituye un delito penal y es sancionable como un delito menor (minor misdemeanor).

De conformidad con la Sección 505.17(D) del O.R.C., la Junta de Síndicos de Franklin Township o su agente designado podrá ordenar que cualquier vehículo estacionado en violación de estos reglamentos sea llevado a un lugar de almacenamiento. El propietario o acreedor prendario podrá reclamar el vehículo presentando prueba de propiedad y pagando todos los gastos, cargos y multas aplicables relacionados con la infracción, remoción y almacenamiento del vehículo.

Las multas establecidas por las infracciones son las siguientes:

- Primera infracción: \$65.00
- Segunda infracción: \$90.00
- Tercera infracción o infracción posterior: \$100.00

Las multas podrán pagarse personalmente en la oficina del Secretario del Tribunal Municipal del Condado de Franklin durante el horario regular de atención, o enviarse por correo a:

Las restricciones de estacionamiento serán señalizadas mediante dispositivos apropiados de control de tránsito, de conformidad con la Sección 4511.09 del O.R.C. La resolución está sujeta a las limitaciones, restricciones y excepciones aplicables contenidas en el Capítulo 505 del O.R.C., las Secciones 4511.01 a 4511.76 y las Secciones 4513.02 a 4513.37, incluyendo las excepciones aplicables a días festivos.

Este aviso deberá publicarse durante tres (3) semanas consecutivas, de conformidad con la resolución.
